Infant Crisis Services Adds Extra Visits for Clients

Nonprofit aims to be resource for families with children during times of economic uncertainty

OKLAHOMA CITY – In light of the looming suspension of SNAP benefits and the ongoing government shutdown, Infant Crisis Services announced the nonprofit will offer extra visits above the regular four per year, both in-house and to its BabyMobile™, for all children under age 4 starting immediately through December 23.

This change is applicable to all clients regardless of the number of times a family has visited Infant Crisis Services in 2025. Each baby or child will receive a week’s worth of essential items free of charge.

Infant Crisis Services encourages all families with young children who find themselves in need during these difficult financial times to use its services to ensure their children receive basics, such as food, formula and diapers.

“Many people may not be aware of our services because they’ve never needed them,” said Miki Farris, Infant Crisis Services co-founder and executive director. “If families with babies and toddlers have suddenly found themselves in unexpected circumstances, they should know that there is help to get life-sustaining necessities for their children.”

Infant Crisis Services is a community resource for any Oklahoma family with children in its service area that is facing financial pressures, even due to reductions of federal assistance or unexpected job loss. Infant Crisis Services specializes in helping those families fill in the gaps while they stretch their budgets.

To receive services, parents and caregivers can call (405) 528-3663 to make a same-day appointment between 9 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The office is at 4224 N. Lincoln Blvd. in Oklahoma City. Services are also available through the BabyMobile, Infant Crisis Service’s mobile diaper and formula pantry. Parents and caregivers can learn when the BabyMobile is in their area by texting (405) 554-2626.
